Many schools now have outdoor classrooms or an ecocabin, to host science lessons and drop-in-to-play board game sessions at break times.

Others may hold Forest School or encourage children to spend much of their free family time at weekends outdoors in forests or public gardens, exploring beautiful local areas such as Winkworth Arboretum or Wisley.
